Two Opportunities To Help Cincinnati's Finest

Train To Be A COPP

Are you interested in keeping your neighborhood safe? Do you want to allow more officers to be on duty in the areas that need them most? Then volunteer to be a COPP! Cincinnati's Citizens On Patrol Program began in 1997 as a way to assist the Cincinnati Police Department keep area neighborhoods safe. COPPs have been the eyes and ears at times that police officers can't be present. These volunteers allow more officers to patrol the streets, while patrolling their own neighborhoods and helping to deter crime.

Each volunteer is required to complete twelve hours of basic police training, an 8-hour ride-along with a police officer, as well as additional training throughout the year. Volunteers will use police radios and cell phones to keep in contact with the officers. Duties can include
